EXCITING ILE PLANS FOR CLASSROOM UPGRADES

Innovative Learning Environment ILE plans for classroom upgrades have been confirmed for Rongomai & Hāmua, along with minor upgrades of Pūtara, Nireaha, Hukanui, Kaiparoro and the office, bathroom & cleaners area to the side of Nireaha. The ILE funding support from the Government is to ensure all schools are able to provide quality learning environments, so that the physical elements of a school ensure the delivery of its educational vision can contribute to meeting the diverse needs of

learners and overall success and wellbeing at school. The classroom acoustics, heating, insulation, flooring, lighting and general appearance and assessed and then plans created by project managers to accommodate

school needs. Currently the project is in the tender process, with draft start dates sometime in Term 3!


WEEKLY UPDATE


