We will need parent helpers on these days - if you are available please contact the school office or email our Sports Coordinator Dean via <u>dparsons@eketahuna.school.nz</u>






NIREAHA NEWS:

We also urge you to use our Kea Crossing and role model good practice when crossing the road and not to cross in between parked cars on the grass verge at the end of the school day.


