ILE DEVELOPMENTS

As the term rolls on we are getting towards the end of the procurement process for the Ministry of Education ILE Upgrade of classrooms. Tenders close early June and they are then put through a 'tender analysis', followed by the Project Managers putting forward recommendations to the Ministry, who ultimately make the decision and confirm the start date. We do know it will commence in Term 3 so are already planning for the impact on classes. Hāmua and Rongomai are having complete upgrades and both classes are required to leave their learning spaces while the work is being done. We are looking to move Hāmua students, and their teacher, into Hukanui, which is already set up to be a two class collaborative space. Rongomai will move into Kaiparoro, which is currently used by the EKetāhuna

Playgroup. We will confirm class moving dates closer to the time. Exciting developments to come - watch this space!
