BUS SAFETY REMINDERS

We have been asked by GoBus to issue a general reminder that the speed limit for passing a stationary school bus that is dropping off or picking up

children is 20 kms in either direction. Further, please remember that children can sometimes run out into the road without looking, and the school bus is a large obstacle that obstructs their view of the road. Also, if you are following a large vehicle that suddenly slows on a rural road, don't assume you can overtake; it might have spotted a school bus and is

can overtake; it might have spotted a school bus and is obscuring your vision of it. On rural roads it's possible to come

around a corner and find a school bus on the side of the road, not leaving you much opportunity to slow down. Please take care in all these situations - especially at school run times - be prepared to have to slow down. Thank you.
